## NOTICE OF RACE

**The Organising Authority (OA) is the Royal Torbay Yacht Club (RTYC)**  
In conjunction with the International Cadet Class Association (ICCA)

The notation (DP) in a rule in the NOR means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification. The notation (NP) in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking this rule.

### 1. RULES

- 1.1. The event will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024 including Royal Yachting Association (RYA) prescriptions.
- 1.2. Competitors should note that the OA implements the RYA Racing Charter and that they will be expected to sail in compliance with it. The charter can be found on the RYA website at [Racing Charter \(rya.org.uk\)](http://rya.org.uk)
- 1.3. The ICCA Class Rules shall apply, except where changed by this NoR or SI's.
- 1.4. RRS 40 Personal Flotation Devices - RRS 40.1 applies and is changed to apply at all times whilst afloat.
- 1.5. (NP) (DP) Torbay Harbour Bye-Laws apply.

### 2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS (SI's)

- 2.1. Sailing instructions will be published on the Official Notice board by noon on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> July 2022.

### **3. COMMUNICATION**

- 3.1. The online official notice board is located at [rtyc.org/cadeteuropeans2022](https://rtyc.org/cadeteuropeans2022)
- 3.2. (DP) While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.
- 3.3. A WhatsApp group may also be used to contact registered mobile numbers for each boat providing notifications and Race Committee (RC) communications whilst ashore. Failure to receive WhatsApp messages shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

### **4. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY**

- 4.1. The event is open to boats of the International Cadet Class, and where both helm and crew are:
  - 4.1.1. members of National Cadet Class Associations affiliated to the International Cadet Class, except that entries submitted by members of the Belarus Cadet Class Association and/or the Russia Cadet Class Association will not be accepted.
  - 4.1.2. aged 17 years or under on 31st December 2022
  - 4.1.3. in a country where there no National Cadet Class Association the entry must be supported by their respective Member National Authority (which is affiliated to World Sailing).
- 4.2. Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form and making payment online at [rtyc.org/cadeteuropeans2022](https://rtyc.org/cadeteuropeans2022)
- 4.3. The OA will acknowledge receipt of entries and payment, and entry information will be posted on the event website
- 4.4. To be considered an entry a boat shall meet all entry requirements and pay all fees.
- 4.5. Entries will be accepted up to midnight on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> June after which late entry fees will apply.
- 4.6. Entries will not be accepted after midnight on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> July.
- 4.7. Parent/Guardian Declarations: All helms and crews under 18 years of age during the event shall submit signed Parent/Guardian Declarations as part of the entry process and submit details of the parent(s) acting in loco parentis.

### **5. FEES**

- 5.1. Entry fees, including berthing shall be £330 and for Late Entries received from June 24<sup>th</sup> 2022 £410.
- 5.2. Late entry fees apply to all payments received after midnight on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> June 2022.
- 5.3. Any refunds shall be at sole discretion of the OA.

### **6. CREW LIMITATIONS**

- 6.1. See class rules C2.1

## 7. ADVERTISING AND BOW NUMBERS

- 7.1. (DP) Boats may be required to display advertising chosen, supplied and positioned as instructed by the OA.
- 7.2. (DP) Advertising shall comply with World Sailing Regulation 20.

## 8. QUALIFYING SERIES AND FINAL SERIES

- 8.1. The event may consist of a qualifying series and a final series depending upon the number of entries.
- 8.2. The qualifying series, if used, shall consist of a maximum of six completed races over three days.
- 8.3. The final series, if used, shall consist of a maximum of six races over two days.

## 9. SCHEDULE

- 9.1. Boats shall check-in upon arrival at Haldon Pier.
- 9.2. Registration will take place on the ground floor Royal Torbay Yacht Club on
  - Saturday 23rd July from 12.00 – 18.00
  - Sunday 24th July from 09.00 – 18.00
  - Monday 25th July from 09.00 – 10.30
  - Saturday 30th July from 09.00 – 17.30
  - Sunday 31st July from 09.00 – 11.00
- 9.3. Equipment Inspection will take place on Haldon Pier, Torquay on
  - Saturday 23rd July from 12.00 – 18.00
  - Sunday 24th July from 09.00 – 18.00
  - Monday 25th July from 09.00 – 10.30
  - Saturday 30th July from 09.00 - 17.30
  - Sunday 31st July from 09.00 – 11.00
- 9.4. The Opening Ceremony will take on Haldon Pier at 18.00 on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> July.
- 9.5. There will be a competitors' briefing on Haldon Pier at 11.00 on Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> July.
- 9.6. Twelve races are scheduled over five days with up to three races a day and a maximum of four races in any day.
- 9.7. At the sole discretion of the RC races may be re-scheduled to take place on the designated lay day depending on prevailing weather and forecasts in order to maintain the intended schedule.
- 9.8. Dates and Number of Races:

- 9.9. On Friday 5<sup>th</sup> August there will be no warning signal after 15.00.

## **10. (DP) EQUIPMENT INSPECTION**

- 10.1. Each boat shall hold a valid measurement certificate in the name of the owner and shall produce it if requested to do so by the OA.
- 10.2. Boats shall be available for inspection at the times specified in 9.3.
- 10.3. Equipment inspection conducted at the UK National Championships 2022 will be considered valid for the European Championships on condition that no equipment has been changed and the boat has not left the boat park other than to race.
- 10.4. Boats shall comply with RRS 78.1 at all times during the event.
- 10.5. A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with Class Rules, NoR and SI's.
- 10.6. The fact that race officials may conduct inspections of a boat does not reduce the responsibilities of each competitor set out in this NoR and SI's.

## **11. CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT**

- 11.1. See class rules C3.1.

## **12. VENUE**

- 12.1. Racing will take place in Torbay, see Appendix A.

## **13. THE COURSES**

- 13.1. Courses to be sailed will be Trapezoid and they will be described fully in the SI's.
- 13.2. The marks will be laid marks and described in the SI's.

## **14. PENALTY SYSTEM**

- 14.1. Appendix P applies. P2.3 does not apply and P2.2 applies to second and all subsequent penalties, This changes RRS P2.2 and P2.3.
- 14.2. Appendix T Arbitration will apply to this event.
- 14.3. It is the intention to appoint an International jury as provided in RRS 70.5

## **15. SCORING**

- 15.1. Appendix A applies except where changed in 15.2 below.
- 15.2. Four races are required to be completed to constitute a series. RRS A2.1 Series Scores is changed to read as follows:
  - 15.2.1. When fewer than five races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
  - 15.2.2. When five to nine races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
  - 15.2.3. When ten or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.
- 15.3. Rule A5.3 applies.

## **16. SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS (DP) (NP)**

- 16.1. Support Boat operators shall register upon arrival and before launching, and pay any applicable fee determined by the OA, except that applications to register by citizens or residents of Belarus and Russia will not be accepted.
- 16.2. Support boats agreeing to be part of the safety fleet and operating under the direction of the Event Safety Officer (ESO) will be allocated berthing and trailer parking.
- 16.3. All other Support vessels are responsible for making and paying for their own berthing arrangements.
- 16.4. At registration support vessels shall notify the OA where they will be located while ashore and where they will be berthed while afloat.
- 16.5. Support drivers shall provide evidence of valid third-party liability insurance.
- 16.6. Support vessels shall display identification flags assigned and issued by the OA.
- 16.7. All Support vessels shall have a kill cord type device fitted and operational at all times whilst the engine is running.
- 16.8. The Sailing Instructions may further limit the activities of support vessels.

## **17. CHARTERED OR LOAN BOATS**

- 17.1. A chartered or loan boat may carry national letters or sail numbers in contravention of her class rules and Appendix G3 RRS, provided the RC has approved her sail identification before the first race.

## **18. BERTHING (NP)(DP)**

- 18.1. Dinghy parking will be provided on Haldon Pier, Torquay Harbour.
- 18.2. Trailer parking for competing boats will also be available free of charge on Haldon Pier subject to availability, or at a secure location nearby.

## **19. HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS**

Does not apply.

## **20. DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS**

Does not apply.

## **21. DATA PROTECTION**

- 21.1. The personal information you provide to the organising authority will be used to facilitate your participation in the event. If you have agreed to be bound by the Racing Rules of Sailing and the other rules that govern the event (the rules), the legal basis for processing that personal information is contract. If you are not bound by the rules, the legal basis for processing that personal information is legitimate interest. Your personal information will be stored and used in accordance with the organising authority's privacy policy. When required by the rules, personal information may be shared with the RYA, your National Authority and/or World Sailing. The results of the event and the outcome of any hearing or appeal may be published.

## **22. RISK STATEMENT**

- 22.1. Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: “The responsibility for a boat’s decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone.”
- 22.2. Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
- a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event.
  - b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore.
  - c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions.
  - d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate.
  - e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats, and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities.
  - f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
  - g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any specific risks to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

## **23. INSURANCE**

- 23.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3 million per event or the equivalent.

## **24. PRIZES**

- 24.1. Prize giving will be held as soon as possible after the completion of racing on Friday 5th August 2022 on Haldon Pier, Torquay
- 24.2. Age category awards will be taken from ages on December 31st 2022.
- 24.3. Details of prizes will be included as an Appendix in the SI’s

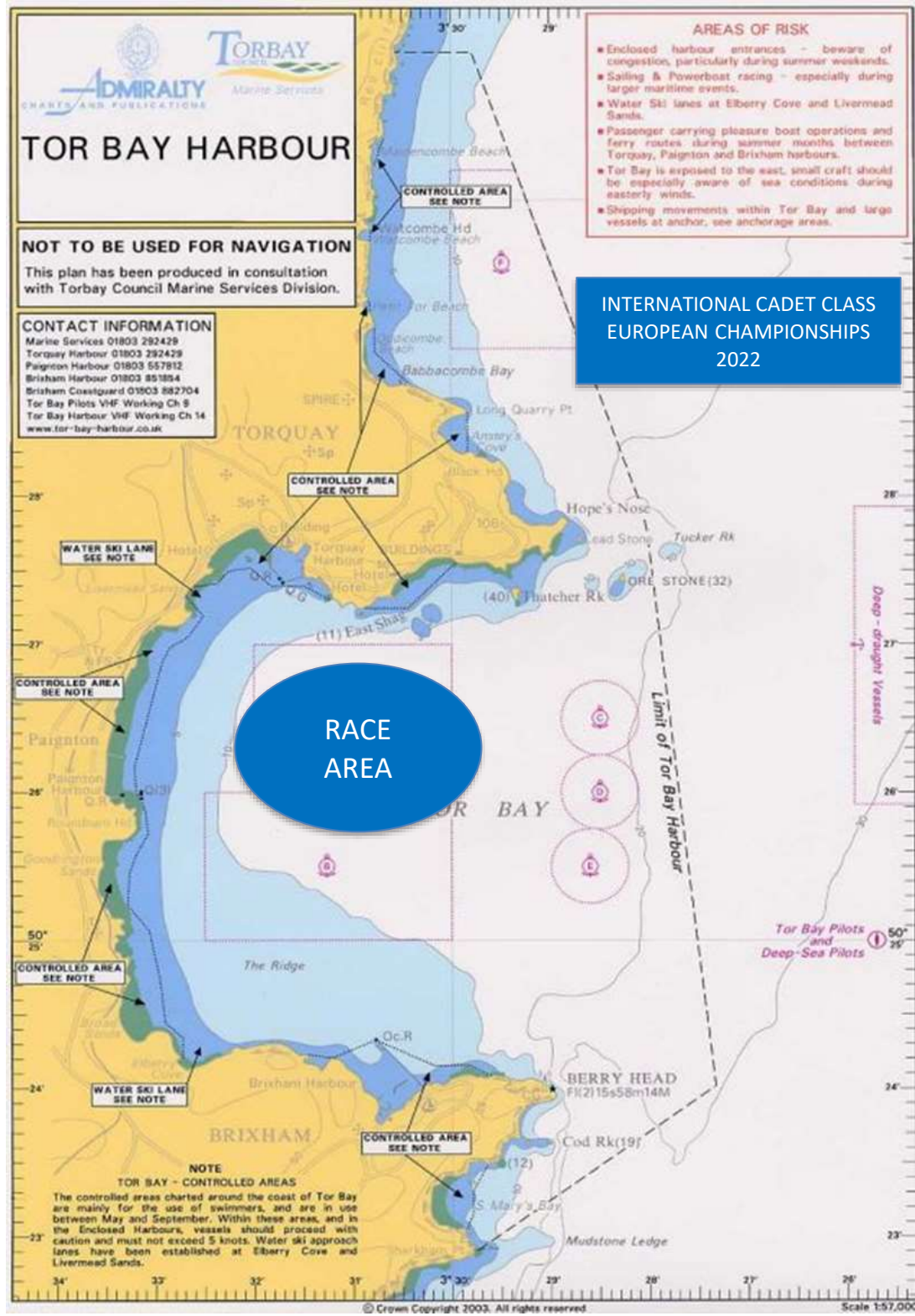
## **25. RIGHTS TO USE NAMES & LIKENESSES**
