HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY STATEMENT

The main objectives of the Royal Torbay Yacht Club are to:-

- Comply with Health and Safety legislation applicable to the operation of the club and its activities.
- Ensure that all reasonable steps are taken to assess Health and Safety Risks and put in place effective control measures.

The club's aim is to prevent employees, members, visitors and anyone else suffering accidents or ill health due to our undertaking.

It is recognised that Health and Safety is a management responsibility, and that the management committee will ensure that effective Health and Safety management systems are implemented. It is also the duty and responsibility of employees, volunteers, and contractors to ensure that they adhere to Health and Safety arrangements put in place by the club and to do everything that is required to prevent injury and ill health to themselves and others.

The club cannot achieve its aims through the efforts of the management committee alone. It will work closely with sub committees and employees in developing and maintaining Health and Safety plans and arrangements.

The management committee will make available the necessary resources to ensure we meet our obligations and compliance with legislation. The management committee will delegate certain operational responsibilities to the club's sub committees, employees, and appointed officers. The effectiveness of the Health and Safety management system to deliver the club's objectives will be monitored on a regular basis and will be formally reviewed on an annual basis.
